By Car:

Leeds has good motorway links to the M1, M62 and M621.

Approaches to Leeds City Centre:

- North: A1-A58
- East: M62 to J29 then M621 to J3
- South / south-east: M1 to J43 then M621 to J3
- West: A65 via Kirkstall
- North-west: A660 via Headingley

By Air:

Many International flights (particularly from Europe) will arrive at Manchester. It is very easy to get from Manchester Airport to Leeds city centre. At Manchester airport, there is a train station and a quick train will take you to Leeds. Price for this train is usually about £13.50 in advance ticket or £26.60 bought on the day and usually takes one hour.

Once in London City Centre you can get take a train from London Kings Cross Station to Leeds with train company Virgin Trains: <https://www.virgintrainseastcoast.com>
 This train line is very comfortable and has lovely views of the British countryside.
 Prices can be as low as £16 single journey or £52 for return ticket when booked early in advance. Book on the day can become quite pricey up to £125 for a single journey ticket, so it's best to book this in advance.
